

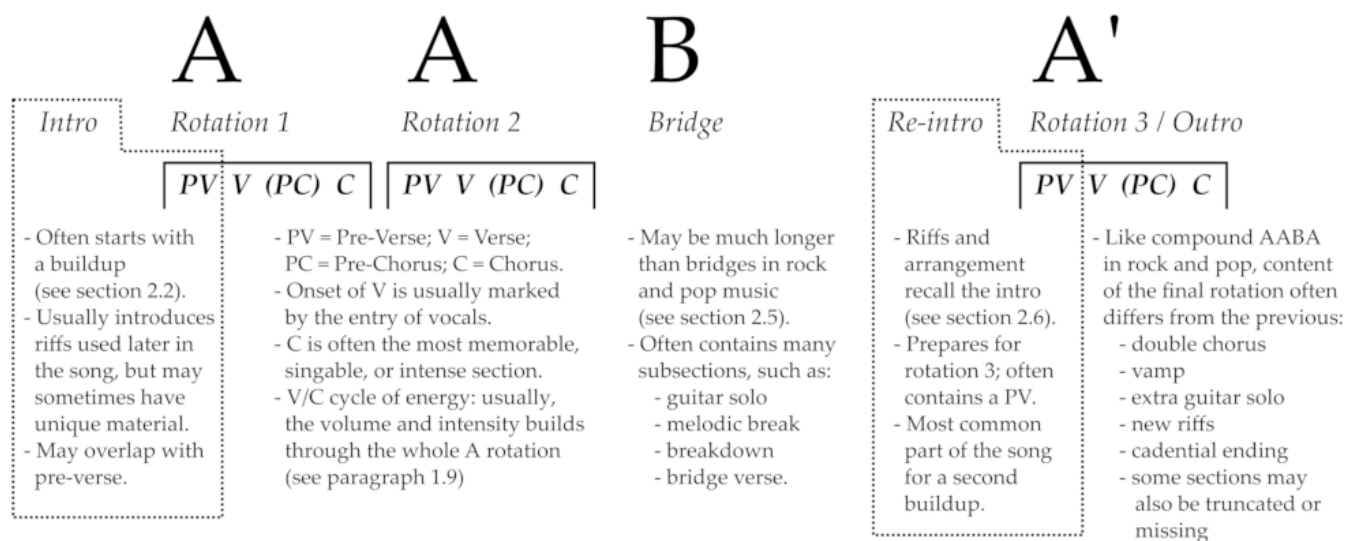

Example 2. Hierarchy of formal structure in metal music

<div>Biggest</div> <div></div> <div>Smallest</div>	Compound AABA	whole song form
	Supersection	either a Verse/Chorus rotation, or a Bridge
	Section	such as Verse, Chorus, Pre-Chorus, etc.
	Module	several contiguous repetitions of a riff
	Riff	distinct melodic/rhythmic idea that repeats

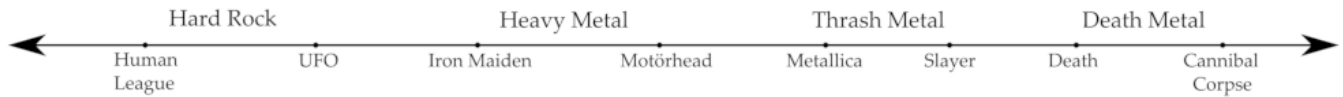
Example 8. Rotational form patterns, with or without Bridge

- Perfect (AABA)
- Incomplete (AAB)
- Two bridges (AABABA)
- Three verses before the bridge (AAABA)
- One verse before the bridge (ABA)
- Two rotations (ABAB or ABABA)
- Extra intro or intro verse (IAABA)
- Simple verse (AAAA)
- Through-composed (ABCD...)
- Repetitive Terminally-Climactic (A A'A'')
